Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Summer Term 1 at Newhall Junior School. We hope that the children are feeling refreshed after the Easter break. We have been so impressed with their hard work and dedication so far throughout this year and we look forward to continuing to work hard this half term.

Curriculum

This half term, we will be studying what makes people go on a journey in History, Materials in Science and understanding 'What is the best way for a Sikh to show commitment to God?' (RE). The children will be focusing on data handling using Excel in Computing, whilst we will be considering 'Positive Relationships' in PSHE. In Art, we will be focusing on sculpture. In Maths lessons, we will be working on shape, decimals, converting measure, negative numbers, volume and position and direction. We will be writing a character description, setting description, persuasive letter and narrative linked to The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe by C.S.Lewis. In Reading lessons, we will be continuing to study both fiction and non-fiction texts.

PE

PE this term will be on a Friday. This session will be outdoors where possible so please can children be dressed to suit the weather. Children should be wearing their school PE kit - please refer to the uniform policy. Children also need to have hair tied back and have removed their earrings or be able to take them out themselves. Swimming will also take place on a Friday.

Lost Property

To cut down on the amount of lost property each term, please could you ensure all items of your children's clothing is clearly labelled. This includes uniform, coats, lunch boxes and water bottles.

Homework and Weekly Tests

Homework this year will be to access Spelling Shed (<https://play.edshed.com/en-gb>) to practise spellings and Times Table Rockstars (<https://play.ttrockstars.com/>) to aid them in developing a rapid recall of multiplication facts. We ask that they complete these activities 4 times per week. This will be monitored by class teachers to ensure participation. Spelling tests will be on a Friday afternoon.

Reading

Your child is encouraged to bring their reading book home each day, along with their reading diary. Please set aside time at home for your child to read quietly or to an adult. Reading at home, when it is a regular habit, has a remarkable impact on reading progress. We ask that children read at least 4 times per week at home and that this is evidenced in their reading diary by an adult.
