Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to Spring Term 2 at Newhall Junior School. We hope that the children are feeling refreshed after the break. We have been so impressed with their hard work and dedication so far throughout this year and we look forward to continuing to work hard in preparation for the SATs assessments in May.

### **Curriculum**

This half term, we will be reflecting on whether World War One or World War Two had a bigger impact on our local area in History. We will be considering 'How the events of Easter and Pentecost impact on Christians today?' (RE) and how to 'Navigate the digital world' (DT). Additionally, we will focus on what a 'Healthy Me' looks like in PSHE sessions, whilst also discussing the children's transition to secondary school. During Maths lessons, we will be studying area, perimeter and volume, angles and statistics. We will be writing a speech and innovative narrative linked to Macbeth by William Shakespeare and a newspaper report linked to a TV campaign of the Three Little Pigs. In Reading lessons, we will be continuing to study both fiction and non-fiction texts. We will continue with the Mini Police programme on Friday afternoons, learning about a range of issues in our community and further afield.

### **PE**

Our PE lessons will take place on a Tuesday and Wednesday. Children should be wearing their school PE kit - please refer to the uniform section on the school website. Children also need to have hair tied back and have removed their earrings or be able to take them out themselves.

### **Lost Property**

To cut down on the amount of lost property each term, please could you ensure all items of your children's clothing is clearly labelled. This includes uniform, coats, lunch boxes and water bottles.

### **Homework and Weekly Tests**

To further support your children at home, we have introduced additional Maths homework to run alongside TTRS. Each week there will be several pages to complete. Every week will focus on a concept or concepts that the children have been taught so far this year so it will allow the children to recall information, this is an evidence-based strategy to revision. Please can your child complete the homework in pencil.

Homework should be completed and brought in each Friday for marking. Your child's class teacher will go over any errors or misconceptions. Please try not to lose these books as they will cost to replace them.

It is an expectation that the children will complete this weekly homework or seek support from their class teacher before Friday, if they need further guidance and input. Any children who fail to complete the weekly homework, will receive a 15-minute lunchtime detention on a Friday, whereby a member of staff will go through the homework with them to ensure they are best prepared in Maths to support with transition to secondary school.

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Children should continue to access Spelling Shed (<https://play.edshed.com/en-gb>) to practise spellings and Times Table Rockstars (<https://play.ttrockstars.com/>) to aid them in developing a rapid recall of multiplication facts. We ask that they complete these activities 4 times per week. This will be monitored by class teachers to ensure participation. Spelling tests will be on a Friday afternoon.

## Reading

Your child is encouraged to bring their reading book home each day, along with their reading diary. Please set aside time at home for your child to read quietly or to an adult. Reading at home, when it is a regular habit, has a remarkable impact on reading progress. We ask that children read at least 4 times per week at home and that this is evidenced in their reading diary by an adult.
